We Are Family

As I write this news letter article for January, I am thinking about Christmas and all the plans I have to be with my family. I am anticipating enjoying them all in my home to eat and laugh and tell the Christmas story and of course open a few presents and take the annual family picture. Families can bring our greatest joy but also our greatest difficulties. Family life is complicated. Because of the miracle of creation, we are all different, even in the same blood family. A "family" by definition is a group of people united by certain convictions or a common affiliation. This means that any group who love and support each other through life's complications is considered family. Joseph, Mary and Jesus were a family. Jesus was perfect but his parents were not perfect. Can you imagine their family dynamics? This is all we know: Luke 2:40 "The child (Jesus) grew and became strong, increased in wisdom; and the grace of God was upon him. Luke 2:52 "Jesus (the 12 year old) kept increasing in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men." This was the family that nurtured and raised Jesus to manhood.

So it is with each one of our families and also the church, the family of God. We are to nurture one another in our family to become more like Christ to grow from babies to adults. Your family may be traditional, blended, single parent, or a group that is unrelated. Your family may be your Bible study group, support group, the people you work with, your neighbors or the church to which you belong. Without family, people are often set adrift with no direction or support which tends to make them less healthy. It is important to provide positive relationships and unconditional love, to foster self-esteem and build positive attitudes within the family unit. You need to communicate and share your joys and sorrows, your achievements and disappointments with one another.

Listen to each other with positive regard for each person's needs and desires. Families, no matter what they look like, are not without conflict. Whatever the disagreement, listen to each other and discuss your difference of opinions and learn to agree to disagree. There may not be total agreement with each other but understanding and hearing each other strengthens relationships.

What does your family look like as you begin the New Year? Where do you need to begin to strengthen your relationships with family? How are you going to do that? What better place to begin than in the Word of God. John the Baptist had it right when he said, "He (Christ) must increase but I must decrease". It is the same for each one of us. We must die to self and begin to live Christ-like lives. Let us begin the New Year by daily renewing our minds and refreshing our spirits with words from scripture like these from Colossians 3:12-17.

"And so, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience: bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. And beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body; and be thankful. Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father."



I challenge each person in our family of God to daily read and dwell on God's word so that through it your family and our church family will grow in grace and become a spiritually healthy family.

Book Review

Most of us have heard of Stephen Curtis Chapman. We have applauded him because of his highly successful singing career. We have mourned with him when his family was struck by the tragedy of his daughter dying. But what else do we know about him?

In the book *Choosing to See*, we are allowed a glimpse into his personal life by his wife, Mary Beth Chapman. She starts by sharing a glimpse into her life as a child, how she grew up not feeling good about herself. How the events molded her into the person she came to be. She shares about how she met Steven and their life as a newly married couple. She recounts the road that led to Steven's singing career, the ups and the downs in their lives that were eventually used as material for the songs that Steven wrote.

You will travel to China as the Chapmans adopt three children in addition to their own three. This decision births two projects by the Chapmans: Shaohanna's Hope, a non-profit organization that offers financial help to others hoping to adopt and Maria's Big House of Hope, a house for special needs orphans in China.

Oftentimes we imagine that highly visible Christians have it all together, but this myth is shattered as Mary Beth tells how she and Steven struggled at times with their marriage, and how their faith in God helped her deal with depression and with the death of a child.

New Year, New Plans

Happy New Year! With the dawning of another year, often people take time to evaluate their life – looking at what they like about their life and what they would like to change about their life. Then they often make a New Year's resolution to try to make a positive change. Some folks decide to go on a diet or exercise. Some people get their credit card statement with their Christmas expenses and decide to develop a budget that will eliminate debt. Some decide they want a better marriage so they decide to work on their relationship with their spouse. Christians often set spiritual resolutions, like having a daily devotion, reading through the Bible in one year, or praying 15 minutes every day. All of these resolutions can be excellent goals.

I read an article by Stephen Shapiro, "Resolutions that Work," that challenged the way I think about New Year's resolutions. Studies show that almost 50% of Americans set New Year's resolutions of some type. That is a whole bunch of people (about 137 million). Do you know what percent of folks succeed with their new resolution? Only 8%! That's a depressing statistic, one that might cause you to make a resolution to make no New Year's resolutions. Before you give up, recent studies have shown that the concept of setting a resolution can still be a tool for creating positive change. The problem isn't in making a resolution, it is in the type of resolution that we make. Too often we set goals that are too specific, that lack thought about addressing long term motivation. Psychologists are finding that people have more long term success with broad based themes than with myopic goals. For example instead of setting a goal to lose 15 pounds or run 30 minutes a day. They would recommend making a resolution for the coming year to "Be Healthy."

As I read the article, I thought about the way Christ encouraged his disciples to move forward in their faith. I thought about how often his instructions were theme based, like "**love the Lord, your God,**" "**love others,**" "**go and make disciples,**" and "**worship the Lord your God, and serve him.**" In fact, rarely does Christ give us, his followers, specific goals that we have to attain in order to please and honor him. I find this in some ways to be very freeing, but in other ways it can be very frustrating. There are times as a Christian that I want to know the A, B and C plan to loving God with my whole heart. I want to know all the specifics about how to love others as myself. But generally life does not follow an A, B, C plan and faith even more rarely is a 1, 2, 3 process. Both generally follow a very winding, up and down path.

So, in regards to setting a New Year's resolution, how would I feel if I resolved to "love God" in the coming year and I did not accomplish some of my more specific goals? Would that be a successful year? Well, if I truly loved God more at the end of 2012 than I did at the beginning, then 2012 would be one of the best years of my life! If my resolution was to "love others" in 2012 and I learned to love others more through the year – all the "others" would think 2012 was a better year. Or, if I resolved to "serve" in 2012 and I truly developed a more serving heart attitude, what a great year that would be! I also wondered what this kind of approach might mean for our church? What if we resolved in 2012 to "love God," or "love others" or to "serve?" And if in the process of 2012 we grew in our faith in this way, would not 2012 have been a good year? Maybe even a great year?

So, I challenge you, my brothers and sisters, to consider what large faith resolution might you make and might our church make that would cause our hearts for God and His Kingdom increase in 2012? Ask me after the first of the year what my broad-based themed resolution for the year is. But if you ask me, you have to be prepared to answer the same question!

May you be a blessing to God and others in 2012!
