REFLECTIONS: Eric Sonsthagen

In Mark 2:23-28, Jesus makes the proclamation that he is the Lord of the Sabbath. In versus 25 and 26, Jesus cited the incident of David and his companions eating the consecrated bread as an example of how rules, even those from God, are not envisioned to take preference over basic human needs. In this way, Jesus is telling us about divine rules that are sometimes overlooked: God made the rules to serve humans, not to rule humans. In these current times of the COVID-19 pandemic, the basic human needs are more pronounced than even before. God's children on the fringes and margins of society are the most vulnerable, and this pandemic has highlighted the disparity as they fight for their basic needs of food and shelter. Many of them are disproportionately out of work and at risk. It is our responsibility as followers of Jesus to bring awareness to these needs and work to fix broken systems, even on the Sabbath.
