

REFLECTIONS: Andrew Kejr

Romans 3-8 is ripe for the picking as this section contains many verses that we memorized as children. For me, Romans 3:23, 6:23 and 5:8 were crucial in my initial understanding of what Christians believed. In these chapters Paul discusses things that separated people from each other-Jew/Gentile, circumcised/uncircumcised and law/faith/works. Paul also makes us acutely aware that we have been separated from God through sin; that we 'All fall short' (3:23) and the 'wages of sin is death' (6:23). Doesn't that sound wonderful? So what hope is there for us if we are separated from each other and from God? Thankfully, Paul reminds us that even while we have been separated from God, Jesus died for us (5:8); 'that the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus!' (6:23) This is the good news of the gospel. Our faith in a crucified Jesus, a resurrected Savior and a living Spirit means that we are no longer kept apart from God and others. Paul encourages us as he was "convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (8:28-29).
