
James 1-5

How many times have we heard that the axiom "God helps those who help themselves" is a myth and not biblical? With no malice toward those followers of Christ who have enunciated this idea, reading James makes me think the "myth" is a myth.

True, the Bible never explicitly says the words "God helps those who help themselves," but it never directly mentions the Holy Trinity, either, does it?

Consider what James tells us: "Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial" (1:12). In other words, the Lord will bless your life (help you) if you battle through hardships (help yourself). Moreover, the entire passage regarding faith and deeds in Chapter 2 underscores this idea. A healthy, living faith in God, James tells us, demands that we sweep into righteous action (2:17). Don't just believe, he's saying, get to work!

Your faithful, hard work will please our Lord, and He will bless your efforts. It's no myth.
