Dear Friends,

Love your neighbor. What reads as a simple command can often prove challenging in our broken and divided world. And yet, churches and believers throughout the Midwest Conference remain faithful to this call as they take intentional steps to extend the love of Jesus to those both within and beyond the walls of the church.

Last April, in an effort to meet a need for shared community space, the Covenant church of Pomeroy, lowa, broke ground for an Outreach Center that will be accessible to community groups and allow the church to connect in new ways. Over the summer, New Community Covenant in Kansas City launched Eastside University, a program that trains youth in the basics of community organizing. These Game Changers, as they call themselves, are putting feet to pavement as they discover, connect, and celebrate the gifts of their neighbors and neighborhood. In Colorado, Arvada Covenant partners with the Colorado Safe Parking Initiative to provide a safe, legal parking location with designated meal and shower nights for individuals and families living out of their vehicles. Across the conference, chaplains regularly enter into broken and hurting spaces to minister to our neighbors in hospitals, hospice care, and prisons, as well as to their families. Each of our conference ministries lives out the command to love our neighbor in ways unique to their own context, and each expression is essential to our shared mission to see lives and communities transformed by the love of Jesus.

It is a privilege to invite you to join us April 21-22, 2023, for our Annual Ministry Celebration, to be held at Countryside Covenant Church in McPherson, Kansas. As part of our time together, we will have the honor of welcoming and voting on the Superintendent nominee. On behalf of conference leadership, I am grateful to the Midwest Conference Executive Board for their wisdom and discernment as they identify the best candidate for this next season of conference ministry.

As your congregation gathers for its own Annual Meeting, know that we join you in celebrating all that God is doing through your church's ministry. Thank you for your steadfast commitment to the gospel as you carry Christ's love into each encounter.

In the fall of 2014, I visited First Covenant Church for the first time. I was in town visiting my girlfriend, Monica (now my wife) who had recently moved to Omaha and had begun attending FCC, while I was finishing my studies at Gordon College on the Northshore of Boston. I had previous connections with the Evangelical Covenant Church, and with the purchase of an engagement ring at Westroad's Mall during that same visit, it was apparent to me early on that First Covenant Church would be a significant place for me in the next season of my life.

After graduating the following May, with a BA in Biblical and Theological Studies. Monica and I married in her hometown in West Virginia and moved into our first apartment in Omaha two days later. The following week, I started my first 'real' job working at the Open Door Mission, as well as an internship at First Covenant Church. During that season, I was fortunate to have opportunities to put my studies into practice and to continue learning from the leadership of Pastors Chris Papenfuss, Brad Bergfalk, Lyle Person, and Chris Logan. More significantly, I got to know the students and community of FCC and developed meaningful relationships. I was, and always will be, grateful for the opportunities to learn, make mistakes, and grow while this congregation supported, encouraged, and affirmed my call to ministry.

Six years ago, in the summer of 2017, I was called to this church as the Youth Pastor, and it is a true joy for me to serve the church in this way. In 2018, I received my Ministry License from the Evangelical Covenant Church, and in 2020 I began pursuing a Master of Arts in Christian Formation through North Park Theological Seminary and will graduate in May 2024. Along with continued growth, these six years have been a season of fruitful ministry as well. I have been fortunate to minister alongside Pastor Greg and Pastor Mary, and the lay leadership of the Love Omaha, and Youth Christian Formation teams. Over this past year, the Love Omaha team has continued to support the organizations of Together, and Heartland Hope, while also forming a new relationship with Abide Omaha, committing to participate in their Second Saturday Serve opportunity every other month throughout 2023. Additionally, the team hosted collections of back-toschool items and Christmas gifts for the residents of Maple Crest Health Center, as well as our second annual Trunk or Treat.

The Youth Christian Formation team kicked off the year on a trip with an amazing group of high school students for Engage 2022 in Arvada, CO, and are making final preparations for our Discipleship Adventure Trip in just a few days. In the year between, Students have gathered weekly for Sunday Formation and Midweek programs, attended Summer Camp and Fall Retreat at Covenant Cedars Bible Camp, and connected with one another through a variety of special events and gatherings.

Looking to the year ahead, I am grateful once again to be affirmed by First Covenant Church and for the privilege of continuing to serve this congregation, now as Associate Pastor. As I take on the leadership of Children's Christian Formation and Love the World, I must express my appreciation for the good work Pastor Mary has done over the last five years and the benefit it has been for me to learn from her experience, leadership, and gifting. I am excited about the ripe opportunities in front of both these teams, along with the whole ministry of the church, and look forward, with hopeful anticipation, to seeing what God will do in and among us.

As I reflect on my time at FCC, I see evidence of God's movement, and I am confident that he has called me to this community. I believe He has gathered each of us in this place and in this season with intention, and I am grateful to walk with each of you as we faithfully pursue God's leading together.

LEAD TEAM

Next you can join a formation group and maybe one that challenges you to get out of your comfort zone and meet new people. These are ways to grow closer to God and each other.

Looking into the next year, we can expect more changes. We have thirteen individuals who have applied for membership, which is great. Also, I'm excited to see what changes will take place with Monica overseeing the children's ministry. Our high school group has a depth that is beyond their years. As an old guy, I find their perspective refreshing. The lead team will also be welcoming three new members, so be praying that they will bring energy, spiritual discernment and humility as they join the team.

What new challenges will arise in the coming year is unknown but whatever happens we will, with God's help, face it together with grace, kindness and gentleness. Romans 12:18 says, "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone." Let us strive to live in such a way that we glorify our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Pastor Greg has preached numerous times that the kingdom of God is here now. May we live into that kingdom that is now, but also not yet.

NARATIVE BUDGET

Every year the Financial Stewardship Team is tasked with developing a budget. This shows where the resources of the church come from (income) and where the resources are expended (expenses).

Income

The majority of First Covenant Church (FCC) income comes from congregational offerings totaling \$660,000. Additionally, we receive rent for parking lot usage, distributions from our Foundations, and other miscellaneous gifts. Finally, as we did in the prior two fiscal years, we will be relying on funds from our reserves in order to balance our budget. Our total income for the 2023-2024 fiscal year is \$860,870.

Expenses

Staff: Our largest expense is for people. The Personnel Relations Team has a budget of \$399,799. This amount pays for salaries, health care premiums, retirement plan contributions, dues and other associated costs to develop and deliver ministry to our church and community. Our staff members work in concert with the Foundational Teams listed below to fulfill the mission of our church. **Formation:** Our Formation Teams focus on teaching us the Good News, equipping us for evangelism, and helping us understand God's great promises. The Children's Christian Formation Team introduces the story of God to children up through 5th grade. The Youth Christian Formation Team works for the spiritual development of our Jr. and Sr. High students. And the Adult Christian Formation Team pursues the continuing transformation of all adults in our congregation. The combined budgets for these teams total \$14,950; these funds pay for Sunday School materials, group experiences, mission trips, DC (Confirmation), and other miscellaneous items.

Worship: Our Worship Team works toward creating a Sunday morning worship experience that is authentic, excellent, invitational, and accessible. The budget for this team is \$8,300 which covers music, technology, and general hospitality for both congregants and visitors.

Stewardship: Our Stewardship Teams work behind the scenes to ensure that all other Foundational Teams have the resources necessary to teach and preach the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Properties Team is charged with keeping the building and grounds in good order and operational to ensure ministry can be accomplished. The Financial Stewardship Team works in conjunction with all other teams to see that all income and expenses are appropriately accounted for and disbursed. The Financial Stewardship Team also supports the Midwest Conference and the National Denomination of the Evangelical Covenant Church, and they are responsible for our mortgage with National Covenant Properties. The total budgeted expense for these teams is \$418,121.

Love: Our Love Teams work to fulfill our church's vision to love our neighbors. The Love FCC Team focuses on caring for, connecting with, and celebrating alongside all members of our congregation, particularly the homebound and those most in need. The Love Omaha Team is tasked with encouraging members of our church to show the love of God to those in the Omaha metro area through acts of service. Finally, the Love the World Team seeks international engagement, supports our missionary families, and maintains our partnership with Iglesia del Pacto Evangelico el Mana in Pedernales, Ecuador. The combined budgets for these teams is \$14,700.




GENERAL FUND PLEDGES
